<p>Discovery Education is filled with a variety of media types. Most videos have closed captioning and transcripts, and some are editable - meaning students can add them or remix them in their own projects. The images include standard images, clip art, and primary source pictures, and all come with a copy & paste citation. There are audio clips that include real world sound clips, audiobooks, podcasts, songs, and sound effects. For textual content, there are encyclopedia articles, reading passages, and primary source documents. And finally, in the Interactives category, there are interactive maps, simulations, and skill builders.</p> <p>Your classroom is filled with learners who learn in a variety of ways.
