| Detailed Description of Use: |
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| Teachers can create a QR code as a link to any text, video, website, or general resource without having the whole URL posted for students. Students are able to then access the resource using the Qrafter App with their iPad or iPhone devices. The photo app also has a QR reader embedded. Examples of when teachers might want to create QR codes: lead small groups of students across various places in the world based on a book they are reading; have students access a video or song to watch in order to have a Fishbowl discussion later on in the day; used as a scavenger hunt format for students in class. Young students can easily access a site, form, video, etc. as simply as aiming their device camera on the QR code. |
